Deregistration & Refunds

NetSetGO Competition

- If deregistration occurs before the first round of training and the player has not taken
 the court, then a full refund of the club fee will be provided. The NetSetGO pack fee
 (part of the Netball Queensland fee component) of \$25.30 will not be refunded
 after registration and the remaining balance of the Netball Queensland fee
 component will be subject to approval from Netball Queensland. The NGCNA fee
 component will be subject to approval from NGCNA.
- If deregistration occurs once the player has attended training or the first round of competition then there will be no refund of the club fee, NGCNA fee and Netball Queensland fee.

Junior -Opens Competition

• If deregistration occurs before grading and the player has not taken the court, then a full refund of the club fee will be provided. The Netball Queensland and NGCNA fee

component will be subject to approval from Netball Queensland and NGCNA.

- If deregistration occurs after club grading but before the competition has started, then
 a partial refund of the club fee component will be provided. An administration fee of
 \$10 will be charged from the club fee and the remaining balance of the club fee will
 be refunded. The Netball Queensland and NGCNA fee component will be subject to
 approval from Netball Queensland and NGCNA.
- If deregistration occurs on or after the first round of the competition then there will be no refund of the club fee, NGCNA fee and Netball Queensland fee.

Grading

Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club has implemented a grading policy to ensure that the grading of players and teams is conducted fairly, effectively, based on players' ability, skill level, attitude and commitment.

We recognise that players have a variety of reasons to play netball and process a range of skills and abilities. We are committed to the development of players, and we encourage play that fits with being fair and competitive, whilst having fun in a safe environment.

NetSetGo players aged 7 - 9 will be invited to a meet and greet to help establish teams. Aligning with NGCNA's NetSetGo Competition teams are formed based on skill and experience, players are placed into teams at experienced, mixed and new. This is to ensure that all children of all abilities have a positive introduction to netball and teaches them the basic skills of the sport and allows the more experienced players to continue to play at a higher level.

Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club will grade each child in Under 10's +. This is a lengthy process, and we will do our best to ensure your child is placed in the most appropriate team. Northern Gold Coast Netball Association also conducts their grading over 3 weeks. As a club, we will do our best to ensure our teams are in the appropriate division for their age, but sometimes it is out of our control.

Training

Our training day is Tuesday.

Location: Pimpama Sports Hub, Rifle Range Road, Pimpama
Times will be dependent on coach availability and all players will be notified in due course.

We endeavour for teams of the same age/ability to train at the same time to assist with coaches available, allowing for gameplay and further development opportunities. We strongly encourage training attendance, and even if a full team is not available for training, there is always something to develop on.

Training sessions are COMPULSORY for ALL players, as it is during training, not in the games, that players will develop the skills required in netball.

If training is cancelled due to wet weather, Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club Committee Members will post on the Main Facebook page, and coaches/ managers will advise each member via text message.

Game Details

Games are played Saturday mornings at Northern Gold Coast Netball Association, Sports Drive, Runaway Bay. Games are played between 8:00 am - 2:00 pm. These times are decided by NGCNA and depend on the number of teams in age groups/divisions and umpire availability.

Wet Weather

In the event of wet weather, Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club will receive notification from NGCNA. The club will then post on our Facebook Page, and Team pages. Coaches and managers should follow up with their team to ensure all members have been notified. If it is raining and you have not heard from your coach, your netball game will still be on!

Game Forfeits

If your child is unable to attend a game due to illness or other commitments you must advise the coach or manager as soon as possible. NGCNA requires all clubs to notify an intent to forfeit before 6:00 pm on a Friday. Failing to do so or multiple forfeits results in Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club having to pay a fee to NGCNA of \$100 for each occurrence

Uniforms

The following items are compulsory for all players;

• Club Dress, black bummers/sports briefs, white socks

All players must be in full club uniform before taking the court for games. This also includes NGCNA's Grading Rounds prior to season start.

- Shoes All players must wear the correct footwear or they will not be permitted to play.
- Jewellery Players must REMOVE ALL JEWELLERY to play and train. This includes ALL PIERCINGS. Taping will not be permitted under any circumstances. Players who refuse to remove any type of piercing will not be permitted to take the court. Please be aware that if your child has their ears pierced during the netball season, they will have to remove their earrings to train and play. This is not an Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club requirement but a rule of the game and as such we are bound to enforce it.

Health & Fitness

Warm Ups

All players should WARM UP and WARM DOWN at every training session AND game. Players should turn up at least 30 minutes before their games to do a proper warm up.

Water

All players are responsible for bringing their own water bottles clearly labelled with their name, to all training sessions and games. Coaches will provide plenty of drink stops during training sessions and players should have a drink of water during each break in a game.

First Aid

Training

The Club will ensure that a first aider is present at all training sessions. Incident reports must be completed for any injury/accident that occurs at The Pimpama Hub facility.

Game Day

For injuries/accidents that occur on game day at NGCNA please report to the first aid window located next to the competition window at the NGCNA club house.

Photography

Equipment

All equipment used is club property and must be looked after and maintained to ensure it stays in correct operational order. If you see any Ormeau Pimpama Royals labelled balls/bags etc, please ensure you collect it and pass on to a Committee Member or Coach.

Club Duty Day

Throughout the year, Ormeau Pimpama Royals are required to complete certain jobs to assist with the smooth-running during competition days. These duties may include canteen duties, grounds set up / take down, competition window, and helping in our stall.

We will require assistance from families to complete allocated tasks, if we fail to meet these requirements the club will be fined by Northern Gold Coast Netball Association.

Fundraising

Unfortunately; player registration fees do not cover all the expenses involved in running and maintaining our club. Each year Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club conducts fundraising to raise money for our club which is required to ensure we can meet all our teams and members expectations and requirements.

Our NGCNA Duty Day and raffle are our major fundraising events and for these events to be successful we really require members to pitch in and lend a hand.

We will also run other fundraising events from time to time such as Bunning BBQs and an hour or two of assistance per team fairly spreads the load.

Complaints and Queries

Dealing with complaints in a mature and professional manner is an important aspect of any sporting organisation. To ensure the complaint can be dealt with in an efficient and confidential manner, Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club has adopted the following grievance procedure for players, parents and coaches:

Step One

In the first instance, a member who has a grievance should speak with the coach and/or team manager involved and see if the issue can be resolved.

If the grievance cannot be resolved, the grievance will move to Step Two.

If an incident/query involving a parent arises which the coach and/or team manager does not feel comfortable dealing with, or does not know how to deal with, the parent should be directed immediately to Step Two.

Step Two

The member with the grievance must put the complaint in writing using Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club's Incident Report form. This form can be found on our

website here. Once completed the form should be emailed or handed directly to the Club Secretary at ormeaunetballroyals@gmail.com. The grievance will then be taken to the Management Committee which will investigate the issue/query and propose a suitable solution

The Management Committee will then decide on the best solution to the issue and inform both parties of their decision.

Using the Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Club's code's of behaviour as guidance of what is acceptable behaviour. You can find the Code's of Behaviour attached in this email and on our website.

Any breach of the Code's of Behaviour may result in a written warning, a ban on attendance at training sessions and/or games or removal from the club. Any such actions will be at the discretion of Ormeau Pimpama Royals Netball Clubs Management Committee and, in the event of dismissal, membership fees will not be reimbursed.
